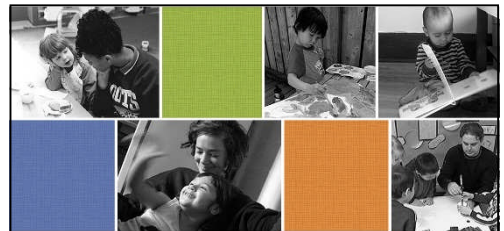
Promoting Resilience in Young Children

Session 1 Adult Skills: (Required) Helps you build on your foundation of resiliency abilities. Learn resiliency skills you can model with children and families including: strategies to stay calm and focused in stressful times; identify how thoughts can affect your ability to cope with stress and challenges; and challenge thinking habits that hinder your resilience.

Session 2 Child Applications: Participants learn to apply resiliency skills with children. Learn to: foster resilience in the children; use resiliency skills to increase your understanding of children’s behaviour; and use child-friendly, play-based approaches to teach resiliency skills in your classrooms.
